



BEHAVIOUR MARKING CRITERIA FOR PRIMARY 4-8 AND HIGH SCHOOL

1. The default number of points each student receives at the beginning of each semester is 100.
2. The default conduct/behaviour mark is: good.
3. Depending on the number of points received at the end of each semester the student receives the following conduct marks:

EXEMPLARY (wzorowe):	above 171 points
VERY GOOD (bardzo dobre):	131-170 points
GOOD (dobre):	90-130 points
ADEQUATE (poprawne):	50-89 points
INADEQUATE (niepoprawne):	10-49 points
REPREHENSIBLE (naganne):	below 9 points
4. For a student who in the first semester received over 171 positive points and has not received more than 10 negative points, all the points over 171 get transferred to the second semester.
5. Student who has received over 20 negative points cannot receive exemplary (wzorowe) conduct mark.
6. If the mean average academic mark for all subject for a student is 4.75 or higher, they receive at least a very good conduct mark (subject to point 5.)
7. Student who receives an official reprimand from the headmaster can receive the annual conduct mark not higher than *adequate*, regardless of the number of points received.
8. Student who receives an official reprimand from the class teacher can receive the annual conduct mark not higher than *adequate*, regardless of the number of points received.
